On May 12, the quiz tool will default to the new quiz create/edit experience in D2L Brightspace.

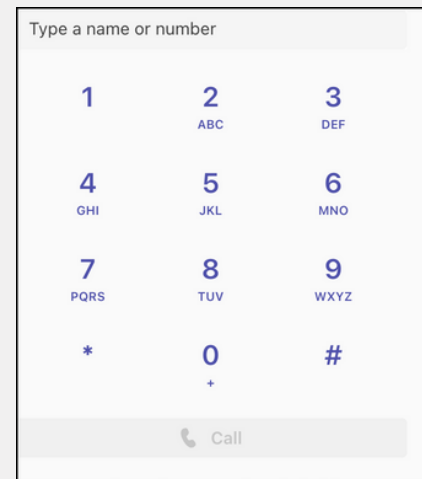

## End of .stu Accounts in D2L

D2L has radically improved the instructor user experience for emulating what a course will look like for students. Because of these improvements, the availability of .stu accounts will end in mid-May of 2023. Instructors will not be able to use .stu accounts but can use the student view feature instead.

Below are some pointers to help you steer clear of Mother's Day gift fraud:

1. Beware of suspicious emails: Check the sender's email address, and make sure it is from a legitimate source. Scammers often use fake email addresses to trick people into clicking on links that lead to phishing websites.
2. Check the URL: Check the web address of the website you are being taken to by hovering your mouse over the URL. Make sure the URL starts with "https" and has a lock icon, which indicates it is using a valid certificate.
3. Don't give out personal information: Legitimate companies will never ask for this information via email, and if they do, they will have a secure way for you to enter it.
4. Be cautious of free offers: Scammers often use free offers to lure people into giving out personal information. Check the legitimacy of the offer before you enter any personal information.
5. Use antivirus software: Make sure your computer is patched with the latest updates and is running antivirus software.

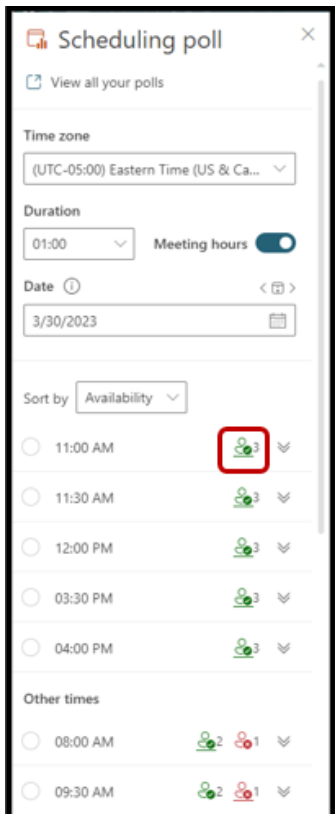

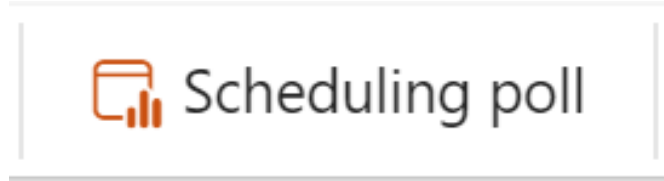


## Introducing Scheduling poll in KSUmail!
